
Subject Leaders at Prior's Mill CE Primary School

in school. She has written the curriculum to ensure that each year group has diverse, exciting lessons each week. This term is also quite a busy one as we will have events such as Mental Health Week, Science Week, World Book Day and Safer Internet Day!



Early Years

The children will be creating a range of Art by having access to open ended craft resources. They will draw and paint while responding to stories they read.

Art in Key Stage One

The children in Year One create Art based on Traditional Tales. They will develop basic skills and explore artists such as Picasso before sculpting a new home for The Three Little Pigs. The children in Year Two base their work on Voices in the Park. They will begin to practise shading and apply their skills to drawing scenes in nature.

Art in Lower Key Stage Two

The children in Year Three study Iron Man. Their Art skills will be developed when drawing self-portraits and creating their own robot sculptures. The children in Year Four create work based on The Butterfly Lion. They will study Joss Rossiter and the animal form. They will enhance their work by using watercolour paints.

Art in Upper Key Stage Two

The children in Year Five will study
Kensuke's Kingdom - another Michael
Morpurgo classic. The children will study a
range of artists and create work based on
island life. Year Six are experimenting with
their mastery skills by exploring William
Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's
Dream.


Our Art

Scattered around school were metal objects for the children to find and draw.










Art Hook in Year Four
